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## Encouraging Report Shows Drop in Rate of Early Elective Deliveries LVBCH Part of National Reporting Effort

**Bethlehem, PA** (March 3, 2014) The Leapfrog Group announced today the national rate of early maternal deliveries dropped for the third year in a row to 4.6 percent in 2013 a significant reduction from the national average of 17 percent reported in 2010. This is the first time the national average has hit the target rate of less than 5 percent and represents the collaborative efforts of The Leapfrog Group, private sector employers and government.

"As a regional rollout organization for the Leapfrog Group's annual hospital survey in eastern and central Pennsylvania, we are encouraged that the national rate of early maternal elective deliveries dropped for the third year in a row," said Tom Croyle, President of the Lehigh Valley Business Coalition on Healthcare (LVBCH).

"Babies that are electively scheduled for delivery before 39 weeks have a higher risk of death, being admitted to a neo-natal intensive care unit, and pose a higher likelihood of having life-long health problems. In addition, early elective deliveries represent a significant cost burden to our healthcare system."

"In addition to the national results, I am especially pleased by the outstanding results of the major hospital systems in the region represented by our employers. All hospitals in our region that reported to Leapfrog are below the targeted 5 percent delivery rate. Further, *Geisinger Medical Center, Lehigh Valley Health Network* and *Reading Hospital* reported 0.0 percent early elective delivery rates," said Croyle. "I think the results show the impact public reporting can have in achieving improved healthcare results

and most of our local hospital systems have responded in a positive manner."
