Houtz is currently the Investigations Unit Supervisor as well as one of the Department's Active Shooter Instructors. Through his work presenting the "Active Shooter" Program, Sgt. Houtz has reached out to hundreds of people at Lehigh University and in the private sector.

Dr. Sam Mayhugh has 36 years experience in health care delivery and management. Dr. Mayhugh graduated from Olivet Nazarene University, Purdue University and Indiana State University. He served as Psychology Department Chair of Olivet University and Pasadena, now Point Loma University. He participated in Harvard Medical School's initial post-graduate program for managed behavioral health and attended Oxford University Executive Programme. He is the founder of IBH and serves in the Office of the President.

Prior to IBH, Dr. Mayhugh was in private outpatient and hospital practice, then founded the following: a 70,000 employee EAP for HCA; what is now WellPoint Behavioral Health; PacifiCare Behavioral Health; and Treatment Centers of America. He is a co-author of the textbook, Managed Behavioral Healthcare: An Industry Perspective. Dr. Mayhugh's work with safety and security departments of IBH's clients has resulted in the U.S. Department of Homeland Security contracting with him, as a Principal Consultant, for training of employers regarding terrorism and threats to high risk employers and management of employees post-violence.
