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Pennsylvania's Spring 2021 Leapfrog Hospital Safety Grades Announced

Bethlehem, PA, April 29, 2021 – <u>The Leapfrog Group</u>, a national nonprofit representing hundreds of the nation's most influential employers and purchasers of health care, and driven in the Lehigh Valley and Eastern Pennsylvania by the Lehigh Valley Business Coalition on Healthcare (LVBCH), announced today the <u>spring 2021</u> Leapfrog Hospital Safety Grades.

The independent grading system assigns "A," "B," "C," "D" and "F" letter grades to general acute-care hospitals in the U.S. based on their ability to protect patients from avoidable errors, injuries, accidents and infections.

In Pennsylvania 125 hospitals were graded, and 56 earned an "A," 31 earned a "B," 30 earned a "C," 8 earned a "D" and none earned an "F." Only one Pennsylvania hospital – St. Clair Hospital located in Pittsburg – has received 'Straight As' since 2013.

LVBCH would like to recognize our local hospital systems and their hospitals that received an "A" including: Geisinger's Geisinger Medical Center, Bloomsburg, Lewistown, Shamokin Area Community Hospital campuses; Lehigh Valley Health Network's Cedar Crest, Hazleton, Muhlenberg, and Pocono campuses; Penn State Health's St. Joseph Campus; and St. Luke's University Hospital Network's Allentown, Anderson, Monroe, Quakertown, Sacred Heart, and Bethlehem campuses.

"The Leapfrog Hospital Safety Grade provides hospitals and patients with the information they need to make informed choices on where they seek care in Pennsylvania," said Carl Seitz, LVBCH President. "In light of the pandemic that eclipsed 2020 and has continued into 2021, driving transparency and accountability across our Nation's hospitals has never been more urgent. We commend our hospitals in Pennsylvania who continue to ensure that the safety of the patients they serve comes first."

"Our members watch the Leapfrog Hospital Safety Grade closely because we know how critical they are to the lives and health of people throughout the Lehigh Valley and Pennsylvania," said Amanda Greene, Director of Operations, LVBCH and Leapfrog Regional Leader. "We care deeply about our hospitals, a point brought home to us by the pandemic, and we hold them to the highest standards because we entrust them with our lives."

Developed under the guidance of a National Expert Panel, the Leapfrog Hospital Safety Grade uses up to 27 measures of publicly available hospital safety data to assign grades to more than 2,700 U.S. hospitals twice per year. The Hospital Safety Grade's methodology is peer-reviewed and fully transparent, and the results are free to the public.
